
**YOU ASKED! WE GAVE!**


## NEED HELP WITH TECH?

## EV CHARGERS AT THE VILLAGE HALL

Following years of the Parish Council trying to get providers to commit, and locations to commit to installing Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations, there are now 2 charging points live on the front wall of the Village Hall.

There have been some initial teething problems, but they are now sorted and the village has public EV charging capability.

The chargers can be used by anyone, a leaflet explaining how to get access to the discounted rate for local residents and how to use the Charging Points will be distributed to Parish households soon. In the meantime, there are now notices up explaining how to use the charging points, anyone with a credit/debit card can do so.

Note, profits from the use of the Village Hall Charging Points are cycled back to the Village Hall.



## PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

The Tockwith Together volunteers in partnership with our Parish Council colleagues are delighted to report that progress has been made on the following initiatives and priorities identified in our Community Plan:

### Marston Road Playground.

We hope by now that any readers of this newsletter with small children have seen and used the completely refurbished Play Park on Tockwith's Marston Road just across from the Stirling memorial. Regular inspections have suggested you have, given the muddy footprints all over some of the apparatus! If you haven't, please give it a try, it really is a step up from what was there previously!

Tockwith Together and the Parish Council have wanted to upgrade the Marston Road Play Park for some time, and the Parish Council seized the opportunity to get the York based company Playscheme, to complete the refurbishment after some careful negotiation with the North Yorkshire department that controls the use of funds, to use the remainder of money previously allocated to the North Yorkshire controlled Prince Rupert Drive green play park on the pressing need to refresh Marston Road.

The new equipment is made with responsibly sourced material and now has a small nature area right at the back of the park, with bird boxes, a bug hotel and wildlife recognition pictures.

Accessibility has been at the forefront of the design, with specific equipment for use by less able children, including a wheelchair accessible roundabout, and the nature area.

### Mobile Library

Following a slightly unexpected approach from North Yorkshire council, the Parish Council has secured regular visits from the North Yorkshire Mobile Library to Tockwith for an hour on a monthly basis. The Mobile Library will be parked on Westfield Lane, just opposite the Village Hall, on a Monday between 13:45 and 14:45pm.

## Pavement Resurfacing

The Parish Council are aware that there was a degree of upset when the well overdue work to resurface the pavements in Tockwith was announced and started at short notice. However, this work was well overdue and it was only possible to get this done, when a planned period of resurfacing in a different Parish had to be cancelled and a suitable equivalent task had to be found for the already booked contractors. Tockwith was chosen, mainly because the Parish Council and the North Yorkshire Ward councillors, regularly pestered the Highways department about the state of the paving and so the task was in the minds of Highways to get done. Who says nagging never works!

The work may not have rectified all the paving faults, but it has made a massive improvement for most of Tockwith and for only a short period of disruption. The Parish Council continue to report the remaining pavement, drainage and road surface issues to keep our problems in the eye of the Highways team, with the intent of getting further works completed.



## THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN MOVES FORWARD

In previous newsletters, and at various community events, we have explained that the Parish Council, with the full support of Tockwith Together, wanted to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish. This would be a statutory planning document, which would be the best way for the community to influence the type, amount and location of new development in the parish over the next decade.

The Neighbourhood Plan has to be prepared under the control of the Parish Council and it will be setting up a specific sub-committee, the Neighbourhood Plan Committee, to oversee the process which will also include non Parish Councillors. Tockwith Together will be involved and provide whatever help it can. The Parish Council has engaged a planning consultant from Sheffield based 'Design Yorkshire' to help it prepare the Plan. There are significant costs, but the Parish Council has now identified how it can cover these costs, in the absence of grant funding, and with no increase to the 'Precept', the Parish Council part of Council Tax.

The first stage is for North Yorkshire Council to confirm that the parish boundaries are an appropriate definition of the Neighbourhood Plan area. The Parish Council submitted their request to NYC some weeks ago and await a response. Once that has been received, there will be a community engagement event in the village hall in the Spring, at which the planning consultant and parish council representatives can seek the views of the residents about the future development of the parish.

**It will be important that the views gathered at this event are representative of the parish as a whole and we urge all residents to look out for further details and participate in influencing what the parish will look like in the future.**

**We will also be needing help from the community to get this right, including volunteers with skills in planning, architecture, legal matters, infrastructure engineering, anything that can really bring the neighbourhood plan to life and make it as robust as possible.**



## JOIN THE CAUSE!

Earlier in this newsletter we have described the progress that has been made on the Action Plan, which formed part of the 2024 Community Plan.

Going forward, in addition to continuing to help deliver the Action Plan objectives, we have agreed to support the Parish Council in preparing a Neighbourhood Plan, to enable us to plan for the types and location of development to meet our community's needs.

Even though a planning consultant will be appointed there will be a lot for the community to do. The Neighbourhood Plan process will require a further Residents survey and a referendum to approve the final version.

Tockwith Together was initially set up in late 2022, with representatives of 12 local groups, together with parish councillors and some residents with specific experience. For the next stage of our development, we would like to welcome some additional members.



- people who are passionate about our community and who want to shape its future.
- people with experience of surveys, questionnaires and analytics
- people with skills in marketing, media and influence
- residents who have moved into the parish in recent years particularly onto one of the newer developments

.

We have c.10 meetings a year, usually on a Saturday morning at 10am in the Village Hall and the meetings last 1.5-2 hours.
